


## Instructions for Tagging Videos

1. Go to the VAT page where you can look up clips. (<http://soe-server.hunter.cuny.edu:8080/vat/library/library.html>). Click on “Find a video clip in the library”.



3. If we enter “Social Studies” as subject area, a list appears and you can then begin by selecting clips you know are from faculty in your program. You should tag all of those first before going on to tag ones with your subject area but from other programs. For example, there are social studies clips from the TESOL and Learning Disabilities programs, which cross subject areas.

5. To the right of the clip you will see a description which should have been entered by the teacher candidate and be non-evaluative. Under this box are a series of drop-down menus. Choose just one from each (if it applies). The descriptors in these pertain to the observation rubric. In the box below the clip called “Viewer’s Notes” you may add in your own program-specific terminology to describe the clip that doesn’t appear in the drop-down menu. For example, in social studies this might be “use of primary documents”. Do not put your name or any judgments about the teacher in this box. Remember that anything you put in this box will become searchable by the VAT library. Don’t forget to choose your name from the “Tagged by:” list and then click on “Save these modifications.”
